### Regular Season Information-

#### In-Season Activities-

- In-season practice with a school coach present - in any sport - is prohibited outside the sport seasons designated in the following table. (Summers are exempt.)

#### Out-of-Season Activities-

- Out-of-Season activities are allowed, but are subject to the following:
  - Dead Periods:

- Only apply to sports not in season.
- Out-of-Season activities are not allowed during the following periods:

Season	Period
Fall	Starts the first week of fall season through August 31st.
Winter	Starts 1 week prior to the first day of the winter sport season and extends 3 weeks after Nov. 1.
Spring	Starts 1 week prior to the second Monday of February and extends 3 weeks after the second Monday of February.
May	Starts on the spring seeding meeting date and extends through the final spring state championship.

#### Sport Rules-

- National Federation of High Schools Rules (NFHS)-
  1. The NCISAA is an affiliate member of the NFHS.
  2. National High School Federation rules apply when NCISAA rules do not cover a particular application.
  3. Visit [www.nfhs.org](http://www.nfhs.org) to find sport specific rules and annual updates.
- It is important for athletic directors and coaches to annually review rules changes each season. Rule Books are also available for online purchase on the NFHS website.
- Rules-

1. Heads of schools and athletic directors are responsible for seeing that these rules and concepts are understood and followed by their coaching staff without exception.
2. Enforcement of all NCISAA rules is the responsibility of each school, each conference, the NCISAA Board of Advisors, the NCISAA Board of Trustees and the NCISAA Office.

## Postseason Information -

### Seeding Information:

1. Opt-Out Date- January 28, 2024
2. Meeting Dates:
  - a. Saturday/Sunday - February 10-11, 2024
3. Committee:


4. For state playoff seeding purposes, all conference games/matches must be completed prior to the seeding meetings.
5. All schools are eligible to participate in the playoffs unless they have opted out.
6. A team must have at least two wins against a varsity opponent to qualify for the postseason.
7. Schools must play 4 contests against 4 separate schools within their classification.
8. In all playoff games, the higher seed will be the home team.
9. See Postseason Rules & Regulations section of the NCISAA Handbook for complete details of the playoff seeding process.

### All-State Voting -

1. Meeting Date: Monday February 26, 2024
2. Meeting Site: The format of the 2024 All-State selection meeting will be a virtual meeting.
3. Each conference must provide a representative. A conference representative that fails to show for an All-State meeting will incur a \$250 fine for their conference
4. Each conference must submit their All-Conference list or At-Large candidates to the state office by the Sunday prior to the state championship.
5. Independent nominations will be represented by the Sport Chair or an At-Large representative.
6. The NCISAA State Office will mail the All-State medals to the athletic director of the All-State recipient's school.

Postseason Definitions-

1. Championships - Each sport season will conclude with a final event - State Championships. Some sports have a 1 or 2 date Championship while others have a playoff period prior to a Championship.
2. Playoff Period - The two week period of time preceding the Championships will be considered "playoffs".
3. Playoff Dates - Within the playoff period, each classification/division will compete on 3-6 dates, depending on how teams are competing. After opt-outs have been established, the playoff dates and brackets will be posted on the NCISAA website. See BRACKETS tab for sport related bracket layout.

**EXAMPLE:**

- Week 1 - Playoffs may be played on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday OR Tuesday and Friday.
  - Week 2 - Playoffs may be played on Tuesday, Friday and/or Saturday.
4. Each round will be determined after the opt out date and posted on the BRACKETS page on the NCISAA website.

a. Championship Date-

Boys Basketball (1A, 2A, 3A, 4A)	Finals will be on the fourth Saturday of February.

Championship Site-

The Boys Championships will be at Ravenscroft School. 1A Boys will play Friday, 2/23 at 7:30pm. Saturday, 2/24 game times will be - 3A Boys at 1:00pm, 4A Boys at 4:00pm, 2A Boys at 7:00pm.

Sport Rules-

Unless otherwise specified, National High School Federation rules will apply.

Mercy Rule-

Once the score reaches a 40 point differential at halftime or thereafter, the game will resort to a running clock which will remain running throughout the duration of the game including administration of free throws or all other dead ball situations except timeouts called by the coach.

#### Officials-

1. For playoff rounds, the host site is responsible for securing officials.
2. When the championship is being played at a neutral site, host schools will work with the NCISAA State Office in securing officials.
  - a. Basketball officiating crews will be asked to officiate 2 games back to back in order to preserve continuity in a given classification for boys' and girls' games.
  - b. Three-man officiating crews will be used for state tournaments in all three divisions.
  - c. All preliminary games to the finals will have officiating crews work two games.
  - d. A three man crew will be used for semi- finals and finals.
  - e. The finals will have 2 three-man crews - one for the boys' final and one for the girls' final.

#### Medical Coverage-

A North Carolina State Licensed Athletic Trainer or First Responder is required for all NCISAA playoff contests.

#### Reporting Playoff Scores-

The host school administrator is responsible for reporting scores to the NCISAA State Office and posting results in MaxPreps immediately after the conclusion of the contest.

#### Uniforms-

1. The higher seeded team will wear white jerseys.
2. The higher seed will be the home team throughout the tournament.

#### Scorebook-

1. Each team is required to have-someone (preferably an adult) keeping their scorebook during each game.
2. The designated home team is the official book.
3. For Championship Saturday, there will be a neutral adult keeping the official scorebook at the table in addition to the team's book.

#### Practice-

During the days of the tournament no team may practice in the gym where the tournament is to be played.

#### Warm Up-

Games will start at the published time-no earlier. However, if a game runs into the next game's scheduled start time, the teams involved in the game will have a maximum of 12 minutes to warm up. By mutual agreement between the coaches involved, the warm up time may be shortened.

#### Complimentary Tickets-

1. Players, coaches, and team managers listed on the official rosters will be issued a Participant Pass to be used for the championship.
2. These are not to be given to parents or fans.

#### Half-Time Performances-

No team may have half time entertainment by cheerleaders, pom-pom girls, etc. at any state tournament.

#### Video Recording-

1. See NCISAA Media Policy in the Handbook (Regular Season/Section 4).

2. No video tape or other filming equipment may be used by a team representative unless that team is playing in the game being recorded.
3. Any NCISAA school found in violation of this rule will be fined \$500.

#### Game Balls-

1. The Wilson WTB0900 EVO NXT Basketball should be used in all postseason contests.
